Conference Location

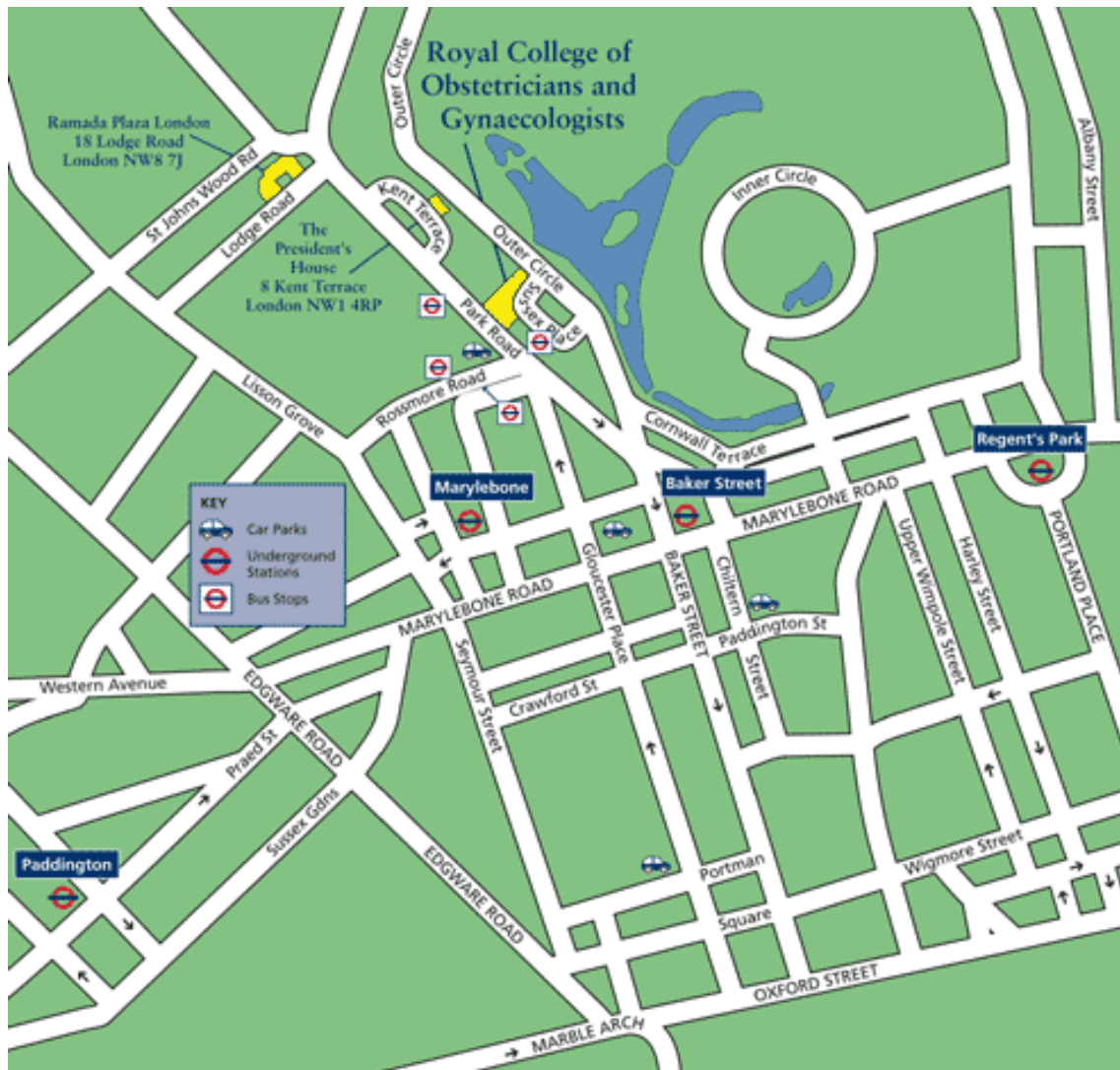
